

**Archetypes:** At their most basic level, archetypes are recurring character types that appear in stories from many different cultures. They can also be viewed as different story-roles that characters or events perform in a story. One character can be more than one archetype. To look at it another way, archetypes are “masks” that characters put on to move the story forward.

<b>Herald</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Announces the need for a quest</li> <li>▪ Forces the hero to act</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Princess Leia's message</li> <li>▪ Gandalf and the One Ring</li> <li>▪ The Tornado</li> </ul>	
<b>Ally or Allies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Accompanies and aids the hero</li> <li>▪ Provides comedy relief</li> <li>▪ Rounds out the hero's personality</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Princess Leia, Chewbacca</li> <li>▪ Samwise Gamgee</li> <li>▪ Scarecrow, Tin Man</li> </ul>	
<b>Threshold Guardian</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Tests the hero</li> <li>▪ Makes the hero face initial fears</li> <li>▪ Can become an ally</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Imperial Stormtroopers</li> <li>▪ The Black Riders</li> <li>▪ The winged monkeys</li> </ul>	
<b>Shapeshifter</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Shifty, has unknown alliances</li> <li>▪ Creates suspense</li> <li>▪ Can be a love interest</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Han Solo</li> <li>▪ Strider (Aragorn), Gollum</li> <li>▪ The Wizard of Oz</li> </ul>	
<b>Trickster</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Uses humor to aid or test the hero</li> <li>▪ Provides comedy relief</li> <li>▪ Cuts the hero's ego down to size</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ R2-D2, C3P0</li> <li>▪ Merry and Pippin</li> <li>▪ The Wizard of Oz</li> </ul>

<b>Loyal Retainer</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Servants who attend the hero</li> <li>▪ Protect the hero and reflect the hero's nobility</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Alfred Pennyworth</li> <li>▪ Dobby the House Elf</li> <li>▪ Samwise Gamgee</li> </ul>	
<b>Friendly Beasts</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Creatures who serve or aid the hero</li> <li>▪ Show that nature is on the hero's side</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Toto</li> <li>▪ Chewbacca</li> <li>▪ Cinderella's mice</li> </ul>	
<b>Devil Figure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The incarnation of evil</li> <li>▪ Offers goods, wealth, or power in return for the hero's soul</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Emperor Palpatine</li> <li>▪ The One Ring</li> </ul>	
<b>Creature of Nightmare</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disfigured or mutated creatures</li> <li>▪ Monsters who oppose the hero</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Werewolves</li> <li>▪ Dragons</li> <li>▪ Hydra</li> </ul>	
<b>Evil Figure with a Good Heart</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Evil character who is redeemed by the nobility or love of the hero</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Darth Vader</li> <li>▪ The Terminator</li> </ul>	
<b>Outcast</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Character with a questionable past</li> <li>▪ Banished from society</li> <li>▪ Sometimes falsely accused</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Robin Hood</li> <li>▪ Han Solo</li> <li>▪ Aragorn</li> </ul>	
<b>Temptress</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Sensuous beauty</li> <li>▪ Tries to bring down the hero through his attraction to her</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Jessica Rabbit</li> <li>▪ Morgan le Fay</li> </ul>	
<b>Platonic Ideal</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Female character who gives the hero intellectual stimulation</li> <li>▪ He is not attracted to her</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Hermione Granger</li> <li>▪ Galadriel</li> <li>▪ Lady of the Lake</li> </ul>	
<b>Damsel in Distress</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Vulnerable female character who needs to be rescued by the hero</li> <li>▪ Can be a trap for the hero</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Princess Leia</li> <li>▪ Sleeping Beauty</li> </ul>	
<b>Star-crossed Lovers</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Two lovers forbidden to be together because of society</li> <li>▪ Often doomed</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Romeo and Juliet</li> <li>▪ Lancelot and Guinevere</li> </ul>
